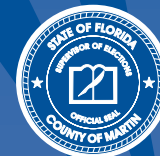

Partner with Us

The Martin County Supervisor of Elections is inviting businesses, churches, non-profits, and PTA's to partner with us on Election Day and show your civic pride by "adopting" a precinct.

Adopt-A-Precinct is a partnership in which a participating organization adopts a specific precinct for an election cycle and provides the necessary personnel needed to work that precinct. At the same time, the organization is raising unrestricted funds for a worthy cause and taking an active role in the democratic process. In turn, the Supervisor of Elections writes a check to the entity specified by the organization rather than paying each individual worker. The program is a win-win for both the elections office and the partnering business. By forming a partnership with the Supervisor of Elections office, fundraising efforts are directed to deserving causes and the voters of Martin County are served with additional quality workers at the polling precincts.

For Your Information

- ★ Florida law requires all poll workers to attend training sessions prior to each election. New workers will be required to attend an orientation and complete online training.
- ★ Poll workers must be registered or pre-registered voters in Martin County and at least 16 years of age.
- ★ Poll workers must be willing to work at the polling precinct until the election is completed.
- ★ Adopted precincts will receive a sign to be placed outside of their assigned precinct with the organizations name.
