A candidate, a political party official, or a political committee official, or an authorized designee thereof, shall be granted reasonable access upon request to review or inspect ballot materials before canvassing or tabulation. Complete and return request form available at <a href="https://www.MartinVotes.gov">www.MartinVotes.gov</a>

Any challenge of a vote-by-mail ballot must be made before the ballots are canvassed, F.S. 101.68(2)(c)4. It may become necessary for the Canvassing Board to reconvene at times other than specified above. If so, the date and time will be announced at the conclusion of the previous meeting, posted online at <a href="https://www.MartinVotes.gov">www.MartinVotes.gov</a>, and posted on the door of the Supervisor of Elections Office.

Section 286.0105, Florida Statutes, states if a person decides to appeal any decision by a board, agency, or commission with respect to any matter considered at a meeting or hearing, he or she will need a record of the proceedings, and that, for such purpose, he or she may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.
